PARK RULES & RESTRICTIONS

Hours of Operation:

- Sunrise to Sunset

Pets:

- Dogs are allowed on the trails within the Park, ONLY if on a leash
- Please clean up after your pet

- 4 - Wheelers
- Bicycles on Walking Trails
- Alcoholic Beverages
- Loud Music
- Fires (except in public grills)
- Dogs or Other Pets in the Playground Area

HISTORY OF FIGHTING CREEK

The name Fighting Creek is among the earliest land tracts mentioned in Powhatan history, listed as early as 1715. The sight had an excellent water supply, an abundance of game, and a plentiful supply of Osage orange trees which were highly valued by the Indians. These factors made the area a coveted spot and various tribes often fought over it. Hence, it became known as "Fighting" Creek. Other sources cite early battles between the Genitoes and other tribes such as the Iroquois who often sent war parties into the area.




