	Appliance cords are kept out of reach of children.
	You are careful not to over load electrical outlets.
	All appliances are kept away from water.
	All appliances cords are in good condition.
	The stovetop is clean of grease and oil.
	Combustibles are kept away from the stove.
	Wear tight sleeved clothing when cooking.
	Never walk away when food is cooking on the stove.
	Handles on pots and pans are turned inward while on the stove.
	Cleaning products are stored out of reach of young children.
	Fire Extinguisher is accessible at an exit and a family members are trained.
	Cool a burn with water, not with ice or other remedies.

	wms and Bathrooms Windows can be opened easily from the inside.
	You have a working flashlight in each bedroom.
	Lightbulbs are at or below maximum wattage prescribed by manufacture.
	Electrical outlets are not overloaded.
	Matches, lighters, poisons and medications are stored out of reach of children.
	Cleaning products are kept in original container out of reach of children.
	Candles are away from combustibles and extinguished before leaving the room.
	Each family member know how to get out of each room (at least two ways).
	All family member know how to crawl low under smoke.
	An escape ladder is available from upper levels.
	Sleep with the bedroom door closed.

## **Exterior of the Home**

Your Address is posted on mailbox/front of your house and visible from the street.
Weeds and brush are cleared at least 10 feet from your house.
Firepits are at least 25 feet from your house and combustibles.

Living F	<u>Room</u>
	Don't overload electrical outlets.
	The Fireplace has a glass/screen covering.
	If there is a smoker in the household, use large, deep ashtrays.
	Metal container is used to remove ash and placed on a non-combustible surface.
	You had your chimney cleaned within the last year.
	Combustibles are not stored near fireplaces or woodstoves.
	Candles are kept away from combustibles and extinguished before leaving.
	Extension cords are in good working order and are not used as permanent wiring.
	e and Working Areas
	The hot water heater set at 120 degrees or lower.
	The furnace or heating unit is checked and cleaned once a year.
	The area around the furnace is clean and not used for storage.
	The electrical panel box is not overloaded and the cover is closed.
	The dryer lint trap is cleaned after each use.
	Cleaning agents are stored in their original containers out of reach of children.
	Avoid unnecessary clutter that adds additional fuel for a fire.

	Oily rags with paint, oil, varnish and polish are kept in covered metal can.
	Gasoline and kerosene are stored in approved and labeled safety can.
	Chemicals are kept in their original containers and stored away from children.
	Lawn mowers are started and refueled outdoors.
	At least on fire extinguisher is available at an exit.
	Portable heaters are used in well ventilated areas.
Smoke	<u>Alarms</u>
	You have a smoke alarm on each level of your home.
	You have a smoke alarm outside and/or inside of each bedroom.
